Hi. I'm a member of Al-Anon. This is how I identify myself in an Al-Anon meeting. If I attend a different fellowship, I identify differently. You don't know how I identify in a different fellowship unless I share this info with you or unless you hear it through the grapevine if my anonymity is compromised. "The only requirement for membership is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend." This is my seat at the Al-Anon table.

Some members refer to me as a Double Winner; some members refer to themselves that way. AFG considers me a Dual Member. Or rather, the Al-Anon Service Manual makes mention of Dual Membership. Page 78 states "Al-Anon/Alateen members who are also members of A.A. are eligible to hold office within their Al-Anon or Alateen groups... and at all times emphasis should be placed on the Al-Anon interpretation of the program," and "Because of the unique nature of both programs, Al-Anon/Alateen members who are also A.A. members do not hold office beyond the group level."

Dual Membership was discussed at the last Area Assembly in Baton Rouge and was a hot topic at this year's Conference. Honesty, what a dual member cannot do matters not to me. What CAN I do? Ah, now this matters to me. How can I serve like other members, or in ways even that other members of Al-Anon cannot?

How can I be of service to family and friends of alcoholics?

- I can share my story. Maybe even at an Al-Anon State Convention some day. Anything's possible.
- I can sponsor a member of Al-Anon and have an Al-Anon sponsor. After meeting state requirements (including two years membership in Al-Anon), I can sponsor a member of Alateen (pg. 78 of the Service Manual).
- I can conduct workshops and be on a Roundup or Convention Committee.
- I can share, as a member of Al-Anon, at drug court (if asked), or in a Treatment Center.
- I can submit writings to the Forum, The Caterpillar etc.
- I can inform clergy, doctors and counselors about Al-Anon & Alateen, and make myself available to them.
- I can practice the 36 principles (Recovery/Unity/Service) of Al-Anon in all my affairs, discovering that far from perfection, these principles relieve me of the desire for perfection.
- I can attend Al-Anon District and Intergroup meetings, Area Assembly, or the Al-Anon International Convention in 2013.
- In an open AA meeting, where friends or spouses sometimes attend for support, I can speak with the friend or spouse after the meeting, introducing myself as a member of Al-Anon. I can provide them with an Al-Anon website card and share my experience, strength & hope which includes "the best thing my wife ever did for me was to work the steps in Al-Anon; the best thing I ever did for my wife and family was to work the steps."
- I can be a participating member of a Home Group and vote on matters that affect the group.
- I can read & study Al-Anon literature, and thus have no reason to quote, in an Al-Anon meeting, non CAL.
- When it's my turn to speak in an Al-Anon meeting, I can identify myself as I choose, perhaps even like this: "Hi. My name's.... and I'm a member of Al-Anon."

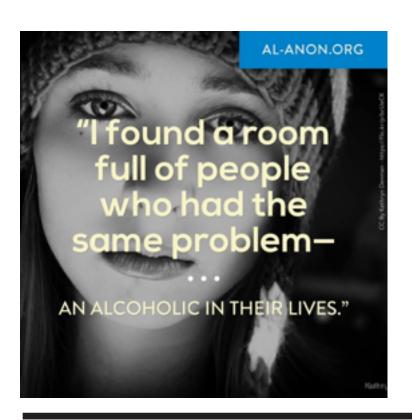
No Pain No Gain

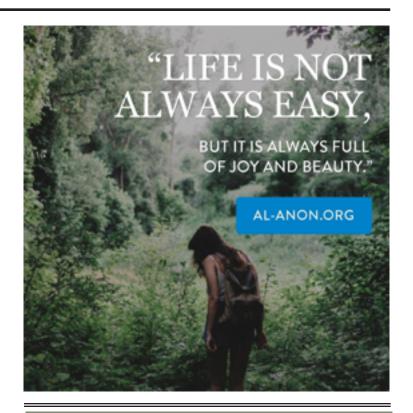
